What is the Ecumenical Institute?

Ecumenical Institute (EI) is a non-profit accredited organization that mobilizes pastoral care in Northwest Iowa. EI provides training and resources for caregivers who strengthen the community through caring and faith in daily life. The core program has been to offer training in spiritual caregiving for these last 50 years. EI's mission lies within this transformational training accomplished through professional in-depth sessions, consisting of 400 hours of instruction and active practice.

Students learn by reflecting on their own ministry experience by applying lessons taught in classroom instruction. The students' ministries in their communities can be either salaried or volunteer. Since 1968, over 600 students have graduated from this institute. Long distance learning is now provided also. In this model students meet together in the beginning of the course and brings closure at the end. In between times, they meet via the internet with their peers and instructor.

In the professional field, EI's training is recognized as a unit of Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) and is an accredited center with an ACPE Certified Educator. Students enrolled in college have often received credit toward their sought after degree from this unit. The unit it provides an aid to seminary students by having hands-on, heart-to-heart training that is expected by their denomination prior to ordination. EI alleviates a growing shortage of pastors by providing more lay leaders equipped for caregiving.

Graduates of the CPE program have become chaplains at hospitals, rural churches, nursing homes, and in the workplace, including factories. Many of the students are in jobs where they serve in social work, hospice, nursing, and counseling. El is striving to provide an innovative holistic approach to community care.
