

While this mission is being fulfilled an interesting phenomenon has also happened. The news of the CPE possibilities through Ecumenical Institute has "leaked"! It seems that people both within Northwest Iowa and around the Midwest and even nationwide have heard of the program through Ecumenical Institute. One student applicant wrote the following:

I have reached out to eighteen CPE programs in fourteen states over the past 3 weeks. From this group, I narrowed my interest down to ten CPE programs, and with further research as well as both email and phone conversations down to six, which is now down to one -- Ecumenical Institute for Clinical Pastoral Education.

Given what has been happening with applications from students across the country, Jennifer Hall, ACPE Certified Educator, and I reflected on the students in 2021. Consider this breakdown of where students are located:

Spring 23 CPE Units Underway

The Spring 2023 units of CPE offered through Ecumenical Institute are underway. Two units with ACPE Certified Educator Roger Cauthon are offered on Wednesday and Thursday mornings. The units began in late September and will continue through mid-March 2023.

The Summer 2023 units will begin in late March and continue until mid-August 2023. There are already students beginning the registration for these summer units.

Each Spring unit has six students with the Wednesday unit being filled with Avera Health chaplains who are continuing chaplaincy training. These students are in clinical chaplaincy positions across South Dakota with Avera Health and supported in their education by Avera Health.

The Thursday group is also composed of six students with clinical placements including two in Tennessee, two in lowa, one each in Pennsylvania and North Dakota. Of these students, one is

completing a fourth unit, one in a third unit, and one is a second unit.

The students reflect the ongoing chaplain educational and professional support that Ecumenical Institute offers to students in acute hospitals, local parishes, retirement facilities, hospice, recovery centers, and mortuary-cemetery sites. There is diversity in age, ethnic background, religious background, and gender.

ACPE Certified Educator Jennifer Hall is also leading a group for the fall 2022. This unit is underway and will be completed in December. There are four students in this group. The Reverend Hall continues to be a great support for Ecumenical Institute by leading groups and supporting the centers work in accreditation with the national ACPE office.

The support that Ecumenical Institute donors give allows this educational and developmental ministry to flourish. Ecumenical Institute is an ACPE center that offers distance education (video conferencing learning) and placement at a clinical site in a student's local area. The need for this offering is noted in the ongoing requests of students that makes Ecumenical Institute a vital part of pastoral care training in lowa and in other parts of the country.

Cherokee Ecumenical Institute Impact Reaches Africa

The impact and influence of Cherokee Ecumenical Institute continues Through local units offered expand. historically at the Cherokee Mental Health Institute, EI has in past years expanded to include video-conferencing distance education which has brought students from across the Upper Midwest and other parts of the United States to EI through the internet connection. Now a story about even further impact.

The summer unit of 2022 had a student who was living in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. His ministry was to the community of Liberian immigrants to the US and involved beginning a parish and outreach ministry supported by the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America. The student, Abraham Gayetaye, took his first unit of CPE. He shared his personal story of arriving in the US after being a pastor in Liberia, West Africa. Personal loss, medical crisis, and recovery through rehabilitation all highlight his story. Supported by the ELCA, he came CPE and the Ecumenical Institute group for the summer 2022 unit. During the unit, Abraham was developing a plan for assistance to local pastors near Monrovia, Liberia. Sharing this with ACPE Educator Roger Cauthon and his ELCA support group in Sioux Falls, plans were made for a pastor's conference when Abraham returned for a visit to Liberia. The following is the report on the conference in Abraham's words:

The conference was good. It went as planned, (3 days straight, Monday -Wednesday was fulfilled). It was a real time success. The turnout was great. The response we received crosses our imagination. The secretariat recorded and reported each day attendance to an average amount of 96. This doubles my 50 participants projection. Throughout the three-day conference, the spirit, enthusiasm, and eagerness to learn from

the audience was high till sitting from 10 discussion to end the session). a.m. to 3 pm each day was just fun.

The seminar has two sessions each day (Monday - Wednesday). First session runs from 10:00 a.m. - noon. Lunch runs from noon to 1:00 p.m. Second session went from 1 - 3 p.m.

Day One: Monday, Aug. 29, 2022

I started the conference with a power point presentation. To lay the foundation, I defined CPE and gave the historical narrative of it. An hour of Lunch took us to the Second session where the second presenter of the day (Roger) took an hour and half to define Pastoral Care in his presentation. Time did not allow Roger, the second presenter to go through his slides at this time. Katherine opted to continue with the rest of your slides on day two.

Day Two: Tuesday, Aug. 30, 2022

During the First session, my PowerPoint presentation focused on After Lunch, Active LISTENING skill. Katherine took the stage, incorporated Roger's reminding slides to hers to make her presentation which was superb.

Day Three: Wednesday, Aug. 31, 2022

On this last day of the conference, I presented on GRIEF during the First session. This was a super sensitive subject to say the least. From the definition I spoke on the Types and Impart of Grief. After Lunch, Katherine came into proxy for Heidi (our day three second presenter), (play her presentation on a recording, read her scripts, and lead

The conference ended well. At the end, participants remarked with words of affirmation of the impart the conference made and requested the seminar become a continuing learning opportunity for pastors and church leaders in Liberia.

For and on behalf of my wife, family, and local team, I want to say heartfelt appreciation to you Katherine, Heidi, and Roger for working with us to make this conference a success. Despite your personal, ministry and family schedules you still made yourself available to do ministry with people of different cultures and many with different religious backgrounds.

At the end of the conference, over twenty (20+) participants registered opting to do CPE if the opportunity is given. From all indications Roger, the stage is high, the quest to embark and or initiate CPE program in Liberia is and will continue to be overwhelming because of the just concluded conference. The three days seminar was intended to test the water and I can categorically say I am in conformity with those seeking CPE program in Liberia.

Through the support of Ecumenical Institute, you have made this conference a reality. Now working with the local church in Liberia and with the national ACPE office, we will explore how this process might emerge. Thank you for your support for the Ecumenical Institute.
