Summer 2023 Units of CPE Underway

The Summer 2023 units of CPE offered through Ecumenical Institute are underway. Three units with ACPE Certified Educator Roger Cauthon are offered with two on Wednesday and one on Thursday morning. The units began in late March and will continue through mid-August 2023. The Spring 2024 units will begin in early September and continue until mid-March 2024. These four units are almost filled. A total of twenty-six spaces are available with only a few spaces open now. The summer unit has seven students in the Wednesday unit being filled with Avera Health chaplains who are continuing chaplaincy training. These students are in clinical chaplaincy positions across South Dakota with Avera Health and supported in their education by Avera Health.

The other Wednesday group is also composed of six students with clinical placements including in Tennessee, Florida, Missouri, and three in Iowa. Of these students, one is completing a fourth unit and one is a second unit. The Thursday summer group is composed of seven students with four clinical placements in Iowa, one in South Dakota, and one in Washington state.

The Spring 24 units will reflect the similar wide reach of Ecumenical Institute providing the vehicle for CPE in Iowa, South Dakota, Nebraska, Michigan, Florida, Massachusetts, and Minnesota.

And most importantly, is to forgive yourself. After all, God forgives us.

My CPE Experience.

Perhaps I need to be honest, my experience with CPE was not what I was expecting. I need to start with a confession - I was hesitant and dreading the CPE portion of my Lutheran denomination's ordination process. Candidates for ordained ministry are required to complete one unit of CPE. The long and the short is, I had initially set out to do CPE for the sake of getting ordained. With our life situation – young married couple, one pastor and one pastor-to-be, and a two-year-old at home, a traditional CPE option was not practical, and it was not something I was looking to do. Additionally, I was also (and still am) serving a congregation that is going through a pastoral transition, as an interim lay pastoral leader.

I have never been so glad to be so wrong.

Through the Ecumenical Institute, I was able to provide pastoral care, in a clinical way, while serving the people that God has called me to serve. This CPE unit was a non-traditional, contextual educational experience that offered me the opportunity to hone my pastoral caregiving skills and it prepared me for work that I am going to do throughout my vocational career.

In a practical sense, being able to bring pastoral care situations to colleagues, from across the country, who are serving in various settings and with various backgrounds, has been a tremendous value to my ministry. Not only has it benefited me but has also been a benefit to my congregation, especially in the depth of pastoral care that I am now able to bring. There is no doubt that I will continue to take the methodology of CPE into my work.

In a spiritual sense, I have been reminded through CPE about the theological approach to life that I bring with me. I have been able to push past the edges of my theological assumptions and to embrace the ambiguity that sometimes frightens those to whom I am providing pastoral care. It was a blessing to work alongside others, from different religious and spiritual backgrounds, who are all excellent pastoral care providers in their own right. What my supervisor Roger was able to add was a reminder that we are doing good and necessary work. We were pushed and challenged to think in new and creative ways. We were called to examine ourselves - had we done enough to really understand another human being?

CPE has been a life changing experience for me – and not in the way that I had anticipated. May God continue to bless the holy work that is happening through CPE.
